


1. About US

4. Strategy for 2021-2025

Executive and coordination functions of the network are performed by the chairman, who is elected every 2 years. The network is governed by a general meeting of member organizations. Decisions are taken by a majority of votes with a quorum.













5. Joint work of the UCN

In May 2019, the UCN held the «Urban Energy Transition Workshop» in Vinnytsia, which was attended by 29 participants from different cities.

In September 2019, all UCN organizations actively joined the International Climate March #GlobalClimateStrike in front of the office of the President of Ukraine. The International Climate March brought together more than 2,000 Ukrainians from 21 cities to Kyiv. They walked on the streets of the capital and demanded that the President, the Government and the newly created Ministry of Energy and Environmental Protection took several decisive actions to address the biggest environmental threats Ukraine faced, including climate change, energy industry, livestock industry, transport and waste.

In November 2019, in Lviv, the Ukrainian Climate Network and 350. org held the first National Climate Ambitions Forum, supported by the Heinrich Boell Foundation Kyiv Office Ukraine, the PROMIS Project and the Federation of Canadian Municipalities, held the first National Climate Ambitions Forum. The event brought together more than 200 participants from 48 cities, towns and villages, becoming the first climate event of this











scale being organized in Ukraine. As a result of the forum, 21 cities signed the Declaration of the <u>Forum</u>, thus confirming the recognition of the world's climate emergency state and supporting the goal of the Paris Agreement.

Additionally, in November, the UCN conducted the «Adapt the city to climate change» training in Kyiv. The event was attended by about 40 participants from different cities of Ukraine comprising representatives of local governments and activists cooperating with the authorities as regards the adaptation to climate change.

WORK WITH CENTRAL EXECUTIVE BODIES OF UKRAINE (CEBs)

Representatives of the UCN presented the stance of the organization in the working group engaged into the development of Ukraine's second nationally determined contribution to the Paris Agreement.

Proposals for modeling the low-carbon scenario were submitted as part of the development of Ukraine's second nationally determined contribution to the Paris <u>Agreement</u>.

Since November 2020, the representatives of 6 organizations of the UCN have been actively engaged in the activities of the working group to develop the National Strategy for Adaptation to Climate Change.

6. Research into the impact of climate change on communities

In 2020, a nationwide sociological survey <u>«Climate Change and Climate Adaptation»</u> was held. The survey was organized online throughout the country, including the Autonomous Republic of Crimea, Luhansk and Donetsk regions. The offline survey was organized jointly by the members of the UCN (NGO "Our home – Maniava", NGO "Ekoltava", NGO "Ecosense", NGO "Voice of Nature», NGO "UMKA") in Kyiv, and Poltava, Zaporizhzhia, Dnipropetrovsk, Ivano-Frankivsk and Rivne regions. Other UCN organizations also participated in completing and distributing the questionnaire, which allowed for collaborating to achieve the project's goals.

2211 respondents from all over Ukraine took part in the survey.

The aim of the research was to estimate the vulnerability to climate change of the residents of different regions in order to advocate for the development of relevant policies by local authorities and the state to overcome the effects of climate change and adaptation.

The survey was created based on seven indicators considered for estimating the vulnerability of a settlement to climate change:

- vulnerability to flooding
- vulnerability to heat stress
- vulnerability of green areas
- vulnerability to natural meteorological phenomena
- vulnerability to deterioration and depletion of drinking water
- vulnerability to infectious diseases and allergies
- vulnerability of energy systems

7. The main achievements of the UCN organizations

Ecoclub has NGO been working on the «Communities promote sustainable energy solutions (CASES)» project. As a result. Voznesensk and Baranivka ATCs have gaisupport and co-financing for the

SUSTAINABLE ENERGY



implementation of their projects. A 50-kW solar power plant was opened in Voznesensk to meet the electricity needs of <u>Voznesensk Water Supply Company</u>.

In Baranivka, the roof of the interschool resource center has been repaired and a 10 kW solar power plant has been installed. The <u>energy efficiency center</u> <u>has also been established.</u>

Ecoclub has also launched an <u>online course</u> for communities named «Local energy projects: how and where small businesses and ATCs can find money for energy projects and more.»

Its purpose is to teach fundraising, strategic planning and cooperation of government, business and the public for the implementation of energy projects.

In 2019, NGO
Ecoaction together with the Energy Transition coalition collected almost 14,000 signatures on the petition for the transition to renewable energy sources by 2050 and handed them over to government officials.

Ecoaction carried out a sociological research



into the attitude of residents of coal cities of Donbass to the prospect of mines closure and fair transformation of the region.



Environmental and humanitarian association **Green World** has organized a series of educational trips to Skala, Zalishchyky, Chortkiv, Terebovlia, Zbarazh as part of an information campaign to promote the transition to renewable energy sources.



In 2019, **Khmelnytskyi Energy Cluster** together with the NGO Ecoclub implemented the project «Synergy of public, government and business actions in the format of an energy cluster for energy reform of Khmelnytskyi region»



<u>Analyzed the potential</u> of renewable energy sources in Khmelnytsky region.

In 2019, the organizations realized the «**Energo-Rupor**» project, the «Activate Energy» informational and educational campaign and the «Khmelnytskyi NPP: threat or opportunity» hackathon.

In 2020, the project <u>«Climatic goals of the</u>

cities of Khmelnytskyi region» was implemented.

NGO **Our home Maniava** implemented a <u>project to improve energy efficiency</u> of the preschool «Sonechko» in the village of Verkhovyna, Ivano-Frankivsk region.

Within the project <u>«Revolving Fund:</u> Partnership for Energy Efficiency» NGO **Economic Development Agency** has created a regional revolving fund in 6 communities of Mykolaiv and Odessa regions.







ADAPTATION TO CLIMATE CHANGE

NGO Plateau held the «Safari for Communities» activity in Lviv to find nature-oriented solutions to such urban problems as deteriorating air quality, irrational use of rainwater, improper treatment of organic residues, and the effect of «urban heat island» among others. In the context of the project, the first bot-hunter for urban problems @Safari_Community_bot was created.

NGO Plateau has created the first public rain garden in Ukraine.

NGO Green World organized an advocacy campaign named









«Monastery Gallows» advocating for the systematic care for trees in the city of Chortkiv.



NGO Environment. People. Law. carried out a study «Protection of swamps. Experience of Europe and Belarus. Lessons and recommendations for Ukraine».



As part of the Ucan Ukraine project, **NGO Dzyga** organized an information campaign and offered support of <u>eco-ideas for</u> small businesses in 4 cities.



WWF refined has and improved the «Water Risk Filter» online resource. This innovative tool can provide an appropriate response on water risks: from acute water scarcity and devastating floods exacerbation of social to tensions and weak regulatory frameworks of countries.



The NGO Voice of Nature NGO held the «Climate Adaptation: Challenges and Prospects at the National, Regional and Local Levels» Ukrainian-German conference in Dnipro and Kamianske.

CLIMATE EDUCATION

NGOs Ekoltava, 350.org-Ukraine and Ecoclub held an educational camp for environmental activists called <u>«Green Camp»</u>.











Eco-club Eremurus held the nationwide competition <u>«Energy and Environment»</u>.

The board of environmental education **Sweet Osvit** and NGO Ecoaction conducted <u>trainings on renewable energy</u> for middle and high school students.





NGO **Ecosphere** organized Green Schools as part of their work with young people. You can learn more about one of them <u>here</u>.

Ukrainian ecological club **Green Wave** organized a few environmental games: 29thnationwide campaign-hike <u>«Cossack Ways»</u> in Vyhraiv village, a public event <u>«My clean community»</u>, <u>summer camps</u>. They also prepared the analytical reviews named <u>«Environmental education for sustainable development on climate change in preschool, secondary, extracurricular and higher education in Ukraine» <u>analytical</u> review and <u>"The challenges of university education on climate change: talks at COP 25» review</u>.</u>











NGO Ecosense organized an informational and educational campaign «Zaporizhzhia for clean energy» to promote renewable energy sources and promote the transition to 100% renewable energy sources (RES).

CLIMATE POLICY

NGO Ecoaction has developed «Α roadmap of Ukraine's climate goals until 2030». The document sets targets aimed at the reduction of greenhouse gas emissions for those sectors that have the greatest impact climate on change: energy. buildings, transport, waste and the combined sector of agriculture, forestry and land use.





NGO Ekoltava conducted a research «Climate (In) Justice: The Impact of Climate Change on Vulnerable Social Groups in Ukrainian Cities», analyzing the city's infrastructure (housing and municipal infrastructure, employment, transport and mobility, public spaces, medicine). They also developed several recommendations for city administrations, public organizations that care for socially vulnerable groups and charity organizations.



NGO Ekoltava led an information campaign «Strengthening of civil society in the implementation of national climate policy» in Poltava. The purpose was to promote the inclusion of climate programs in the pre-election campaign of candidates with their further implementation, after the election of the current city administration.



NGO Plateau conducted a research <u>«Climate goals of Lviv»</u> (a guide for those who have been elected to the city council).





NGO Economic Development Agency together with the representatives of local authorities of Buzk, Prybuzhanivsk and Oleksandrivsk ATCs implemented the project «Increasing the local climate ambitions of <u>the communities in Mykolayiv region».</u>

As part of the project «Climate Targets of 2030 for Zaporizhia» project NGO advocated **Ecosense** the adoption of «Zaporizhia Climate Change Adaptation Plan» and prepared educational information brochure for local the government named «Vulnerability to Climate Change and Climate Targets in Zaporizhia and the Region».





TRANSPORT



NGO Plato has developed a series of <u>educational videos on sustainable</u> <u>mobility in Lviv.</u>

NGO U-Cycle together with the Ukrainian Bicycle Network started the development of the National Bicycle Strategy with the Ministry of Infrastructure of Ukraine. They also presented the research <u>«The need for the development of cycling transport and obstacles to its implementation in cities and regions of Ukraine» research.</u>



Moreover, they conducted the National Public Campaign $\underline{\text{«I AM FOR VELO»}}$ for the local elections of 2020 in 26 cities and ATCs in Ukraine.

In 2020, the **U-Cycle** team developed 5 cycling frameworks for Sloviansk, Melitopol, Kherson, Berdiansk and Opishnia ATCs. Today, more than 30 Ukrainian cities and communities have approved cycling frameworks, more than 20 of which have been developed by U-Cycle experts since 2014.



NGO Forza has launched the project «SUMCITYNET: Cities for Accessibility and Climate-Sustainable Urban Mobility» project, which aims to address the challenges faced by modern cities: congestion, harmful emissions, limited urban accessibility for cyclists, the elderlyand people with disabilities.



WASTE

NGO Ekoltava advocated for the adoption of a municipal <u>solid waste</u> management program in Poltava.



NGO Zero Waste Lviv held an educational campaign «Without polyethylene» in retail chains in Lviv involving ten of them. The campaign reached the national level and was supported by the Ministry of Ecology and Natural Resources, as well as the United Nations Development Program in Ukraine.

In addition, Zero Waste Lviv implemented

a socio-cultural project «Composters for housing cooperatives». Composters have been installed on the territory of 4 housing cooperatives in Lviv to raise public awareness of composting and waste sorting. Public organizations and housing cooperatives from Uzhhorod, Boryslav, Drohobych and other Ukrainian cities benefited from the project.








Furthermore, they coordinated the international campaign <u>«Enwiron Menstrual Week»</u> in Ukraine to encourage the use of reusable menstrual hygiene products and to draw attention to health damage, costs, environmental pollution caused by the use of disposable menstrual products.

NGOs **Zero Waste Lviv** and **Ekoltava**, in partnership with the «Fama» Research Agency, conducted the <u>«The research of new environmental impacts in the context of the COVID-19 pandemic situation in Ukraine».</u>

NGO Environment.
People. Law. carried out the research <u>«The concept of «zero waste» – from theory to practice»</u> research and published the handbook <u>«The European best practices of waste management»</u>.

These two manuals are intended for the public and will assist in the implementation





of environmentally friendly solutions in the field of waste management by local governments and executives.

BIODIVERSITY



WWF has published the annual research <u>«Wildlife Study on global biodiversity and global health trends»</u>


NGO Kryvyi Rih Human Rights So-

ciety has been conducting long-term monitoring of compliance with the protection status of the landscape reserve of national importance «North Red Beam».






MGO Environment. People. Law. created "The «Nature Reserve Fund: Green Treasury of the Community» manual, dedicated to the responsibilities of ATCs and local governments as regards the management of the land use and protection. The manual reveals the aspects of achieving sustainable ecosystems and improving the quality of life of communities through proper organization of protection of particularly valuable reserved areas.



The manual «How to save the forest? Public participation in forest management" is written to help all, who care about the preservation of Ukrainian forests and want to know more about how to get involved. The manual has an applied direction and consists of a theoretical and practical part, contains an overview of the current picture of forestry in Ukraine and our vision of where we should aim in the future. Much of the information provided in the handbook is based on the experience of other countries.



The manual "Land Management: Environmental and Legal Aspect" is devoted to management issues in the field of land use and protection, including land use planning, land management, land use and protection, land monitoring, etc. through the prism of environmental safety. In addition to the theoretical part, the manual contains an analysis of case law and recommendations.



8. COP 25

Due to the UN international climate talks held in Madrid in December 2019 involving 196 countries, the Ukrainian Climate Network published the position of 33 environmental organizations on the Ukrainian climate change policy.






